



BEACH BY PAT C.

We are seeking a certified lifeguard to complement our dedicated life guards George and Brendan. To apply, please contact Pat Canavan at 845-583-7539.

This year's Smallwood branded item is being selected and will be available for purchase at the Beach.

Finer grained sand such as one might find at an ocean beach was requested in the past. Unfortunately, such sand is not suitable for our beach as it is too easily blown and washed away.

The countless complaints about wafting cigarette smoke, particularly around children and the elderly, and discarded cigarette butts can no longer be ignored. Smoking is already banned in public parks and beaches. In an attempt to avoid prohibiting smoking at Smallwood Beach, the immediate area around the **Tony Romano bench** will be the **designated smoking area**. Kindly comply with beach rules.

Life guards and gate keepers are the only paid staff the Civic Association employs. Maintenance and administrative tasks are performed by member volunteers. This arrangement keeps our dues affordable. If you can, please stop by for an hour on Beach Clean-up Day, Saturday, June 4 starting at 10am in preparation for the opening of **Smallwood Beach** on **Saturday, July 2 @10-6**. Depending on lifeguard availability, the Beach may open a week earlier, Saturday, June 25 @12-5 — once determined to be posted at the gate & online.

LAKE BY BOB B.

The question "What is a bathing beach?" was posed. The formal definition is a bathing place, together with any buildings and appurtenances, and the water and land areas used in connection therewith, at a pond, lake stream or other body of fresh or salt water which is used for bathing or swimming with the express or implied permission or consent of the owner or lessee of the premises or which is operated for a fee or any other consideration or which is openly advertised as a place for bathing or swimming. Per State Sanitary Code, Statutory Authority, Public Health Law, 225: **Water Quality** Bathing beaches shall meet the water quality standards for bacteriological physical and chemical quality as specified by the following: **bacteriological quality** The total number of organisms of the chloroform group shall not exceed the logarithmic mean of 2400/100mi for a series of 5 or more samples in any 30-day period, nor shall 20% of total samples during the period exceed 5000/100mi. The fecal chloroform density from a series of 5 or more samples in any 30-day period shall not exceed a logarithmic mean of 200/100mi. **chemical quality** The water shall be free of chemical substances capable of creating toxic reactions, skin or membrane irritations to the general public. **physical quality/water clarity** In all bathing areas except the Great Lakes or ocean beaches it shall be possible to see an 8-inch black&white disk in 4 feet of water. Clarity tests should be performed at a 4-foot depth in the bathing area at a minimum of 3 different locations.

In June and again in August former board member Peter Conroy assists me with the sampling of Smallwood Lake water and submission to a state certified environmental testing laboratory. Results may be found at our website and general meetings.

The Youth Committee's goal is to provide group activities, modified to suit various age categories, primarily at Lake Hill Lodge. During July and August, Kickball, geared towards kids under age 12, will take place on Saturdays at 9:30am in Smallwood Park. In addition to scheduled events, on rainy/cool weekend and holiday afternoons when beach going may be undesirable, the Lodge will be open, when available, from approximately 1-3pm for arts&crafts. Visit smallwoodcivicassociation.org/45.html for a preview of what is being offered along with supply donations sought. Adult participants and volunteers are always welcome. Parent participation and supervision of his child along with a signed waiver holding Smallwood Civic Association harmless is required. The Association is not a certified child care provider.

If you are applying for a boat sticker or purchasing a new boat, kindly inform us of the boat's type, length, color, material and number of seats. To receive your boat sticker, this information must be included along with your signature on the back of the application stating that you have read and agree to abide by all the boating rules. All this is necessary so we can be safe and continue enjoying the lake.

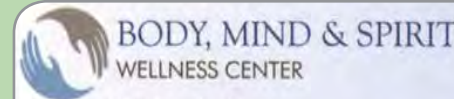

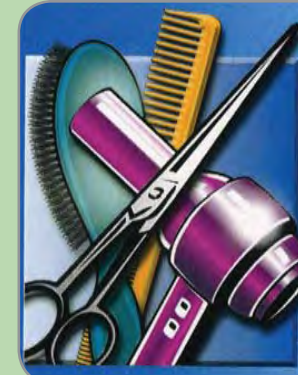
